Historical Fiction Novels

The Bread Sister of Sinking Creek

Here is the unforgettable story of Maggie Callahan's struggle to survive in the wilderness of Central Pennsylvania in the 1770's. Armed with her knowledge of bread-baking and a strong streak of stubbornness, Maggie overcomes the daily dangers of everyday life to find a place for herself on the Pennsylvania frontier. Paperback, 130 pages. For grades 3-6.

Remembering Maggie: The Complete Bread Sister Series

This Special Collector's Edition contains the complete text of all three books: *The Bread Sister of Sinking Creek*, *Maggie Among the Seneca* and *Up the Frozen River* in one volume, along with *A Guide to Living the Dream*, which includes historical background and commentary by the author. Paperback, 400 pages. For grades 3-6.

Pirate: The Pursuit and Captivity of Captain Jack Scarfield

In 1718, at the height of The Golden Age of Piracy, a Quaker boy from Philadelphia embarks on the adventure of a lifetime when he joins a crew of bounty hunters determined to sail into pirate-infested waters and track down the notorious pirate and ship-burner Captain Jack Scarfield. Based on a true story. Paperback, 170 pages. For grades 3-6.

The Bigfoot Expedition: A Wilderness Adventure

Follow Wildlife Biologist and Bigfoot Hunter Dr. Morgan Tanner as he joins a research team searching the forests of the Pacific Northwest for a creature who walks like a man and has an uncanny ability to melt into the shadows. The question is: What will they do once they find him? Includes a cryptozoologist's guide to understanding the Bigfoot phenomenon, past and present. Paperback, 150 pages. For grades 3-6.

The Cherry Tree Buck and Other Stories: Tall Tales from the Pennsylvania Mountains

Follow Robin and his grandfather through six barely-believable tales from his boyhood in the Pennsylvania mountains. In this humorous collection, you'll meet a toothless rattlesnake, an eagle who thinks he's a chicken and, of course, a cherry tree buck. Are they true? You be the judge. Paperback, 80 pages. For grades K-6.

Lost in the Woods: Mysterious Stories from the Pennsylvania Mountains

Continue Robin's adventures with his grandfather as they spend their days in the thickly-forested woods of Central Pennsylvania, exploring the beauty and mystery of the natural world. These imaginative tales encourage us to discover all that can be lost and found in the deep woods. Paperback, 100 pages. Includes resource section on Pennsylvania folklore. For grades 3-6.

When the Moon is Full: Supernatural Stories from the Pennsylvania Mountains

Here are six haunting folktales drawn from the rich folklore of the Pennsylvania Mountains. In these pages you'll encounter a wolf hunter enchanted by a she-wolf, a boy who must face a mystical bear in the midst of a dark swamp and a girl who watches a stuffed panther come to life in the moonlight. Includes resource section on Pennsylvania folklore. Paperback, 100 pages. For grades 3-6.

Running with the Caribou: Twelve Traditional Tales from the Natural World

Here are twelve multi-cultural stories of young men and women who found courage, cunning and compassion in the natural world.
